"I585[?]" "Alameda[...]" Size: L 9 3/4 x D 2 1/2 inches. History: Stone mortar and pestle found in one of Alameda's mounds. The information on the pestle can be connected to a donation documented in the museum records: Subject: One Indian Mortar and Pestle. Date received: April 1954. Unfortunately, as a result of earlier inattention there is no further description, and as a result of later inattention during moves and minor catastrophes, it is not certain the mortar and pestles are together anymore, and the connection has been lost.
