



Survey Results: House All Alamedans & End Homelessness

Proposed New Projects (6)

- [Council] Identify ongoing funds for Dignity Village (affordable housing development).
- **[Council]** Plan for new housing along and on Main Street in the area outside of AP fenceline between Big Whites and estuary, and in the area along and on the part of Main Street and green area immediately west of Bayport, between RAMP and Stargell Way.
- **[Council]** Research if development ideas outside of but adjacent to AP proper counts to Navy-Alameda housing cap.
- **[Council]** Review existing and propose new incentive programs for city public safety professionals to rent or own a home in the city.
- **[Council]** Eliminate the supermajority requirement to approve lease or sale of city-owned buildings.
- **[Council]** Modify Alameda's "housing first" policy so as to better account for and prevent individuals seeking housing at Alameda Point with violent criminal histories, and, as necessary REQUIRE appropriate social services enrollment.

Edits (1)

• **[Council] HH7** – Implement the Housing Element and provide incentives to shopping center sites to develop residential units.



Survey Results: Enhance Community Safety & Services

Proposed New Projects (3)

- **[Council]** Add creation of police officer retention program for mid-career officers (years 6 to 10).
- **[Council]** Add creation of higher visibility community policing in Park and Webster Streets business districts.
- **[Council]** Develop/Enhance a community notification system to ensure that residents are immediately aware of tsunami, fire, and earthquake dangers.

• [Council] CS21 – Add regional use and revenue focus and possible regional police training component to CS21.

Proposed Remove/Defer (2)

- [Council] CS 32– Council referral to study current zoning regulations for liquor stores. [+2]





Survey Results: Invest in Transportation & Infrastructure

Proposed New Projects (4)

- **[Council]** Add daylighting at priority intersections.
- **[Council]** Create economic development events and city website videos to educate residents on city efforts to attract new businesses in commercial districts, shopping centers, business parks, and Alameda Point.
- **[Staff] TIE 36 [NEW] {edit}** Support businesses and the community through the construction of the Oakland Alameda Access Project, including clear and frequent communication with input from an engineer at all meetings.
- [Staff] TIE37 [NEW] Dredging and repair at Alameda's piers.

Edits (2)

- [Council] TIE 15 {edit} Design and construct a Commercial Street Program (striping, parklets) for Park Street and Webster Street that is attractive and aesthetically pleasing.
- [Council] TIE 33 {edit}–Implement increased cyber security measures and ensure this remains an ongoing effort.

Proposed Remove/Defer (2)

- **[Council] TIE8** *Drop* Advocate for AC Transit service enhancements for Alameda Point and Northern Waterfront (currently partially served by Line 96 and 19).
- [Council] TIE17 <u>Defer</u> Implement paid parking at ferry terminals.

Prioritized List [Council]

- **TIE 21** Rehabilitate 8 miles of sewer pipes.
- **TIE 22** Underground utilities at Otis/Broadway.
- **TIE 25 –** Implement the City's Alameda Point Disposition Strategy renting and leasing City properties.
- **TIE 26** Expand Citywide business economic development activities, including an Alameda Point attraction and retention program.
- **TIE 31** Plan for redundant and resilient City communication networks and phone system to help ensure access in an emergency and implement free public WiFi.
- TIE 35 Protect historic resources.
- [STAFF] TIE 37 [NEW] Dredging and repair at Alameda's piers.



Build Resilience to Climate Change & Water Level Rise





Proposed New Projects (1)

• **[Council]** Consider policy to eliminate balloon sales and penalize release of airborne balloons.

Edit (3)

- [Council] CC9 Update the Zero Waste Implementation Plan and provide public technical assistance.
 - Look for ways to reduce emissions from food production, limit impact on small businesses, and find resources to compost bio plastics.
 - Consider establishing a comprehensive recycling facility similar to Richmond Recycling Depot.
- **[Council] CC6b** Implement the Oakland-Alameda Estuary Adaptation Project, which includes flood protection for the Webster-Posey tube area, *including developing resident education programs/tours and/or city website videos.*

Proposed Remove/Defer (1)

• [Council] CC 12– Implement Solar Project on Doolittle (Mt Trashmore).



Proposed New Projects (2)

- **[Council]** Bring back local cable programming, in partnership with local schools.
- **[Council]** Research if the East Bay Public bank is a fiscally responsible option for Alameda in the future.

Edits (3)

- **[Council] GOV 1** Develop and implement a Municipal Fiscal Resilience Plan to help weather financial challenges and remain fiscally stable over the long term, and consider an independent audit or consultant.
- **[Council] GOV10** Review and consider election reform <u>through charter amendments</u>, including but not limited to district-based elections and adoption of mayor pro tempore.
- **Council] GOV15b** Explore an infrastructure bond to fund deferred maintenance and new infrastructure needs. Consider a vacancy tax or other legislative policy to penalize unoccupied commercial units.
