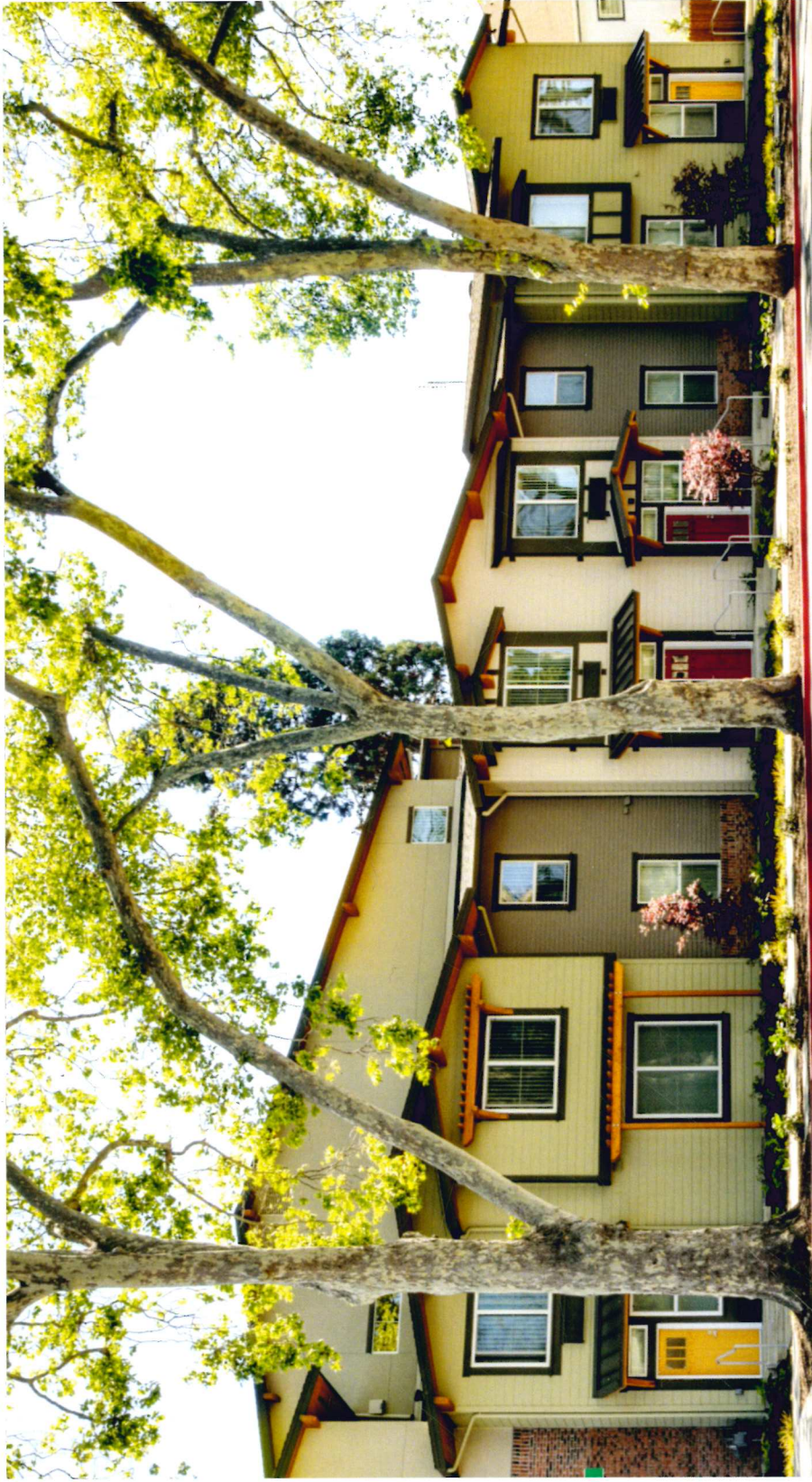

Weinreb Place serves very low income seniors in Alameda County with incomes at 30% to 50% of the area median income level. The new community features a computer learning center/library, community room, laundry facilities, and a large courtyard with outdoor seating, a barbecue, and a community vegetable garden.
