Free Bus Pass Program Overview

Eligibility

- Low-income residents 65 or older. Pass holders must maintain Mastick Senior Center membership
- Low-income residents aged 18-64 with a certified disability



Free Bus Pass Participants



Free Bus Pass Program Feedback

Cost Considerations

- Currently at top of Measure BB Paratransit budget
- High enrollment, active riders
- Fare increase implications
 - 230,000 rides * \$0.25 increase = \$57,500
- City response
 - Prioritizing budget for Free Bus Pass program
 - Additional income verification requirement with enrollment renewal summer 2025
 - General Fund request for FY2025-2027
 - Study program alternatives



Program Alternatives with Rate Increase

- **A. Limit Program**: Within existing Paratransit Measure BB funding, reduce enrollment through renewal and stricter income verification.
- **B. Maintain Program:** With a moderate General Fund budget addition, maintain existing program size (clear waitlist after renewal/income verification).
- **C. Convert to EasyPass:** Transition to the flat rate EasyPass program instead of pay-as-you-go. *Feasibility and fiscal impact TBD.*

- 18+ residents enrolled in East Bay Paratransit

• 171 participants (as of 3/4/2025)






AIM Program Ridership
