What is CDBG?

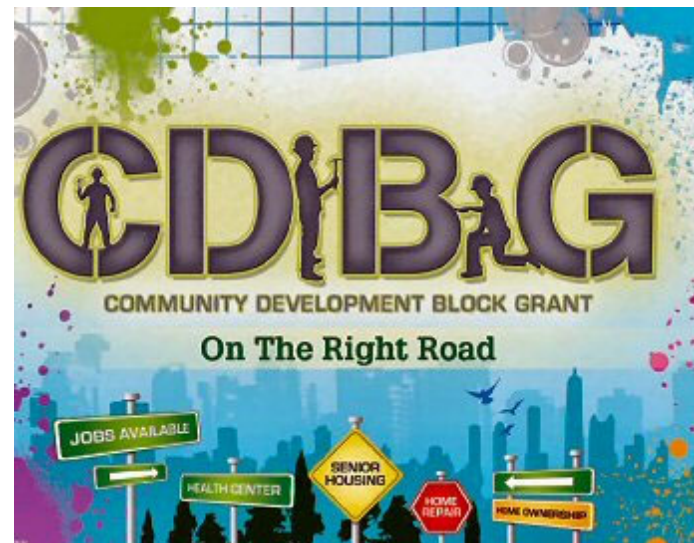
Federal funds to assist low- and moderate-income persons by providing:

- Decent Housing
- Suitable Living Environment
- Expanded Economic Opportunities

- Five-Year Strategic Plan
- Annual Action Plan
 - Programs
 - Activities
 - Resources



Non-Housing Public Service Priorities Identified by SSHRB

Five-Year Strategic Plan Priority - Preserve Alameda's "Safety Net" services by prioritizing funding for programs. These priority areas include:

- Mental Health Services
- Food Security and Nutrition Programs
- Access to Housing and Emergency Shelter
- Advocacy and Coordination
- Age Friendly Communities
- Social Connectedness

Stakeholder Outreach & Community Needs Assessment

- Staff contacted 39 local service providers last year to get input on community needs
- The needs indicated that safety net services are a top priority
- This year we did not survey local organization and service providers due to upcoming 2026 Community Needs Assessment (CNA)
- The 2026 CNA will give an in-depth analysis on priority areas and statistics to back these findings

Stakeholder Identified Needs

Staff received 15 responses with the following needs:

- Access and Connection to Resources
- Affordable Housing / Rental Assistance
- Food Programs
- Legal Services, including Fair Housing
- Mental Health Services
- Senior Connections/ Community Outreach
- Healthcare Services
- Unrestricted Funding

Funding Availability

Public Service funding comes from 15% of the following:

- Entitlement Allocation from HUD
- Program Income received in the previous fiscal year

Program income is generated from the repayment of CDBG residential rehabilitation loans.

Program income continues to be received through June 30

- Staff estimates expected amount
- Annual Action Plan updated prior to submission
