Public Art Ordinance

- Adopted in **2003**
- Requires most projects with development costs over \$250,000 to dedicate 1% of their construction costs to public art.
- This artwork can be located **on-site**, or the developer can choose to **contribute an in-lieu fee** to the public art fund.
 - On-site artwork is chosen by the developer, with PAC review and approval
 - The Public Art Fund is used for physical and cultural arts grants, as well as maintenance of existing artwork.



Public Art Program Activities

- Issue and administer Public Art Fund grants
 - Physical Artwork
 - Cultural Arts and Arts Programming
- Facilitate the review and approval of On-site Public Artwork
- Manage and maintain Alameda's inventory of public art
- Staff the Public Art Commission
- Other activities such as disseminating Public Art updates via an email newsletter, writing talking points for Commissioners, developing Program materials and resources.







Public Art Timeline: 2015/16

- First program staff hired
- Two large contributions to the Public Art Fund
 - Average balance prior to 2015: \$65,000
 - **2016** balance: \$375,000
- Revisions to the Public Art Ordinance
 - Removed the \$150,000 cap on Public Art Fund contributions
 - Removed historic or maritime requirement
 - Allowed grants to non-profits from the Public Art Fund
 - Removed maintenance and administrative costs as allowable uses of the Fund

Public Art Timeline: 2017 to Present

RFPs for Physical and Cultural Arts Grants released

5 physical art + 7 cultural arts grants awarded

16 grants small grants awarded

1 in-lieu artwork and 1 on-site artwork installed

Addl revisions to Ordinance

8 Cultural Arts grants awarded

2 in-lieu artworks and 4 on-site artworks installed 2 on-site artworks installed

Public Art Master Plan Adopted by City Council



 - Requires detailed proposal in first application round
- Request for qualifications
 - Requires more general information,
 followed by a detailed proposal from a short list of compensated applicants.
- No identification of artwork location



Lessons Learned

2. An RFQ is the industry standard for most physical art grants

3. Prior to releasing an RFQ, staff should identify and evaluate locations for physical artwork

4. In most cases, public art should be limited to public property

5. Successful implementation of public art in Alameda requires efficient use of staff time and opportunistic use of resources.



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
