- •4,281 square foot lot shared by two buildings, totaling 2,832 square feet.
- Building A constructed by 1885, possibly earlier, builder unknown.
- •Building B constructed 1890 by A.R. Denke.
- •"S" designation on the Historical Building Study List








HISTORIC CONDITIONS







PROJECT SITE

- •Building A (pictured on top) is a one-and-a-half story endgable dwelling with a recessed front entry.
 - Current Use Vacant
 - Original Use Saloon with second floor residence, possibly moved from the original location on Park Street.
- •Building B (pictured on bottom) is a single-story commercial building with significant alterations to the original façade.
 - Current Use Restaurant
 - Original Use Shown on Sanborn maps as a "store" on the west side and a "Chinese store" on the east side.











EXISTING CONDITIONS

- Inclusion on the study list based on the location within the Mastick Park subdivision, the likely builders, and the exemplary craftsman style.
- The loss of the original architectural features diminishes the design, materials, and workmanship integrity of the building.
- Since the 2022 fire, no applications have been received for repair or reconstruction.
