Background – Capital



• ARPD receives capital improvement funding annually from the general fund in the following categories:

Playground Replacement: \$325,000
Paving and Walkways: \$300,000
Park Improvement Fund: \$325,000
\$950,000

• Staff evaluate how funding is spent based on conditions of park amenities prioritizing safety, condition, age, and distribution by location.

• Unspent capital funds are rolled over and allowed to build as projects often far exceed the annual contribution.

 Operating funds only cover a portion of total costs and often utilize differed capital funding to make operational repairs or replace park assets.
