
Background

 - Commission establishes name criteria
 - a. Community survey to solicit name ideas
 - 2. Commission selects top 10 names
 - b. Community survey of top 10 names
 - 3. Recommend final name to City Council
 - 4. City Council make the final determination of the park name

Diversity & Inclusion for Facility Names

- The Naming Policy includes the following requirements:
 - A focus on local Alameda significance but may reflect California or a national lens as appropriate.
 - A person must be deceased for at least three years to be considered.
 - Names must reflect values of inclusivity and diversity.
- Consider the demographics of existing Alameda Parks named after people. Alameda park names should be inclusive of everyone in our community and reflect our diversity.
- Current park name demographics:
 - Gender: 17 Men, 6 Women and 1 Not Specific
 - Ethnicity: 19 White, 2 Black, 0 Latinx, 1 Indigenous

Established Name Criteria: "The uniqueness of the park's location on the pier and estuary with an intersection with diverse and inclusive cultural significance in Alameda."




