The Mastick Senior Center Advisory Board (MSCAB) and the City of Alameda recognize the importance of nourishing the mind, body and spirit of Alameda's senior community. These core elements are the focus of our program.

Mastick Senior Center offers a wide range of support services that assist Alameda residents as they age in place. Many of these services are offered in conjunction with the County of Alameda and include: information and referral, consumer presentations, health insurance counseling, legal assistance, and transportation services. Other support services include: notary, dental and podiatry consultation, and tax preparation assistance.

In 2014, Mastick Senior Center and Alameda Family Services partnered to offer Senior Connections, a pilot program providing Alameda seniors with access to much needed case management services.

More than Just a Meal...

As the Center celebrates more than 34 years of service to the community, the nutritional needs of older adults remain an area of focus and importance. The mid-day meal program provides a well-balanced meal, as well as an opportunity for members to socialize.

During 2014, over 6,620 lunches were served to members.

During this time, 30,000 pounds of food were distributed to seniors participating in the Mercy Retirement Brown Bag program offered twice a month at the Mastick site.

In addition, Mastick volunteers planted, nurtured, and harvested greens, herbs, and vegetables providing 3,131 baggies of food to Mastick's members.


Healthy, Active Living...

Mastick Senior Center is committed to offering a wide range of activities to fulfill intellectual, physical, and social development. During 2014, members engaged in enrichment offerings as follows:

- 23,064 Fitness Classes (such as Yoga, Fitness, Dance, and Pilates)
- 24,842 Intellectual Classes (such as Computer, Foreign Language, Current Events, Ceramics, and Quilting)
- 17,242 Social Interaction (such as Cards & Games, Special Events, and Sing-Along)

Mastick Senior Center Advisory Board (MSCAB)

The MSCAB is the active administrative advisory committee for the Center. It provides advice and counsel on all matters connected with accomplishing the mission statement. The MSCAB is committed to fundraising activities including Bingo, the Thrift Shop, and a direct-mail letter to our membership which help to defray the cost of programs and building maintenance.



During 2014, the MSCAB invested \$23,134 specifically for capital improvements to the facility. The Mastick Senior Center Advisory Board has provided over \$1.1 million for capital improvement projects over the past 34 years.

The MSCAB raised \$169,710 from fundraising activities, helping to offset program expenses.
