Our library is a hub for the community. Hosting numerous community meetings and events, in addition to 890 library-sponsored programs & events.



We value community



Our community showed its love for the library with gifts to the **Alameda Free Library Foundation's "2,015 by 2015" campaign, providing \$50,000 in supplemental funding** for all collections.

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Through the operation of Dewey's Friends Café and semi-annual Used Book Sales, the **Friends of the Library** provides funding for special library programming by **giving more than \$48,000 annually** to the library.



We are one of Alameda's favorite destinations. An average day includes over 1,200 visitors, more than 1,400 items checked out, over 300 computer log-ins, and at least 17 meeting & study room uses. Last year, items borrowed exceeded almost 500,000.

The 1,000 Books Before Kindergarten program has over 741 children signed up and many have achieved their goal.



Our summer reading program helped 2,995 kids, 127 teens and 189 adults read and return to school or work refreshed and ready to learn.





Our School Resource Services

program took the library's passion for reading and learning to nearly 5,800 Alameda children through library visits, classroom visits, special programs, and much more.

Computer classes and Homework Coaching assisted over 1,400 Alamedans of all ages in their quest for knowledge.

We value education

Alameda Reads, our Adult Literacy program, celebrate 30 years of assisting low-literacy adults learn to read. In FY 2014-15, almost 4,000 volunteer hours sustained this program.





The Library played a **critical role in the digital lives of Alamedans.** Over 111,300 people utilized access to the Internet, for online job applications and other essential information with library computers or wireless access.

The **Homebound Delivery** program extended a lifeline of books and other library materials to people who could not get to the library. Over 526 deliveries were made.


