Mastick Senior Center offers a wide range of support services that assist Alameda residents as they age in place. Many of these services are offered in conjunction with the County of Alameda and include: information and referral, consumer presentations, health insurance counseling, legal assistance, and transportation services. Other support services include: notary, dental and podiatry consultation, and tax preparation assistance.

In 2015, the MSCAB authorized funding through FY 2017-18 for the Senior Connections program provided by Alameda Family Services. This program is offered at Mastick Senior Center and provides Alameda seniors with access to much needed case management services. As the Center celebrates more than 35 years of service to the community, the nutritional needs of older adults remain an area of focus and importance. The mid-day meal program provides a well-balanced meal, as well as an opportunity for members to socialize.

During 2015, over 5,572 lunches were served to members.

During this time, 30,000 pounds of food were distributed to seniors participating in the Mercy Retirement Brown Bag program offered twice a month at the Mastick site.

In addition, Mastick volunteers planted, nurtured, and harvested greens, herbs, and vegetables providing 3,083 baggies of food to Mastick's members.
