Barstow	Staff was exploring the topic but the inability to regulate what goes into the greywater system stopped the concept immediately. The fact is, there is no way of controlling what goes into the greywater system, and how that may affect the groundwater. Our Industrial Pretreatment Supervisor did not recommend pursuing it at this time due to the non-biodegradable detergents and other chemicals that are likely to be used. Suggests, as an incentive instead of a requirement, providing a three-way valve for simple laundry to landscape systems.	
Encinitas	Adopted an ordinance requiring pre-plumbing for all new single-family homes for grey water piping. Developed a handout and submittal requirements and waives fees for typical residential installation.	http://www.encinitasca.gov/index.aspx ?page=490.
