Dear President Atkin and Members of the Library Board,

This letter is to bring you up to date on activities during the months of May and June, and to provide a look forward to some of the projects which will be coming up.

Library Services Reports: (Consent Agenda). The April and May 2016 Library Services Reports are included in your Board Packet. The Expenditure Reports for May and June are also included.

City News. No new information regarding email accounts for Board and Commission members.

The City's Commission on Disability Issues representative to the Library Board, Ms. Susan Deutsch was present at the May meeting. Rather than be a "regular" report on the Library Board agenda, she prefers to receive an agenda in advance of the meeting and will attend if she sees an item of interest to her Commission. She will speak during Public Comment and after hearing her concerns and comments the item can be agenized for action if necessary.

Main Library Update. Summer Reading is here. Family Fun Day kicked off the summer reading sign-ups on June 18. Over 670 children and over 150 adults and teens signed up for their respective reading programs. As you entered the library you may have noticed the wonderful poster on the stairway landing advertising summer reading. A new poster will be added to a panel each couple of weeks during the summer. Most of children, friends, or spouses of library staff "getting caught" reading. An inexpensive yet eye catching marketing poster. The children's program is themed: "Read for the Win" and the adult/teen program is "Find your Summer Adventure." The teen/adult program is experience based so try something new this summer!

Kicking off this summer is a visit by the Scholastic Reading Road Trip Bus along with a few authors, costumed book characters and other giveaways. We have scheduled them to be parked in the Main Library parking lot on Wednesday, June 22, from noon to 3:00 p.m. This was a joint endeavor between the Boys & Girls Department and Books, Inc.

The Library has signed up to participate in the Mayor's 4th of July Parade under the organization of our new Teen Librarian, Hallie Fields. At this point, "Words on Wheels" our mobile library, will be the centerpiece of our mostly walking contingent. While I will be out of town for the 4th of July I understand that the staff, their families, friends, and other willing volunteers, will showcase library related programs or materials. Some will wear sandwich board book covers; others will have a Libraries Outdoors back packs; or summer reading accountrements! Will wait to hear the results before the July Board meeting.

Lots of programs to be held this summer, keep your eyes on the list of events at the end of the Board Letter. No special children's programming will be scheduled in August except the End of Summer Reading Party on August 24. School begins earlier this year and the end of summer program was scheduled before the school calendar was published, so the Library's end of summer reading party will be after the school year has begun.

Integrated Library Systems (ILS). Supervising Librarian Marlon Romero continues to exceed my expectations in managing the ILS procurement process. He made a brief presentation to the Library Board in May regarding out selection process and requested a Resolution of Support (for purchasing our selected ILS) from the Board. He negotiated the contract with Innovative Interfaces and acquired the necessary signatures. At the June 21 City Council meeting, the request to the City Council to approve the contract passed on the Consent Calendar. Once the "wet" signature copies are received back at the library, he will send one to Innovative and begin discussions with one of their engineers to set the timeline for installation of hardware and implementation. Marlon has included staff training and expects to have the launch of the system in October or November. Each location will be closed for two days for hardware installation and training.

Library Foundation/Friends of the Library. The *new* Executive Board met for the first time in April. The group has decided to hire an outside consultant to help merge the two organizations, conduct a visioning process, interview stakeholders, develop goals & a strategic plan, create new branding, and help to launch the marketing of the new organization. They hired Rose Chastain from Chastain Consulting. She works with non-profits, is local, and has done work with Rhythmix, the Boys & Girls Club, and others. She either has or is in the process of interviewing stakeholders and has met with the new board for their first visioning meeting. There are at least two more meetings with Rose scheduled. The new organization plans on using the 10th Anniversary as the launch of the new organization.

The 10th Anniversary plans are moving forward; the 10 year olds in front of the 10 year old building photo is scheduled for September 10. Saturday, November 5 will have a hip-hop dance party for toddlers & preschoolers in the morning, a panel library history talk in the early afternoon and a musical family program with the Alameda String Academy in the afternoon. Sunday will have a fundraising concert at Rhythmix, performer(s) still to be arranged. Save the date cards should have been sent to the council, city manager's office and library board members by now.

The Live @ the Library concert series will still go on this fall, basically in the same format. September 17 will be a jazz pianist; October 22 will be the return of Jonathan Poretz, who sings Sinatra & Sinatra era songs (he was great fun the last time he came)! And since the library anniversary is in November, the Live @ the Library series will conclude in December on the 10th.

The next Friends meeting will be on Monday, July 18, 2016, at the Main Library in the Stafford Room at 7:00 p.m.

Alameda Reads. Alameda Reads held four sessions, or 10.5 hours, of volunteer training in May. Eight people completed the group workshop sessions. Five of them have already participated in a program offering like the reading practice group, the writing workshop or the book club, and the other three are scheduled to join one of the upcoming groups. Two volunteers have already "shadowed" an experienced tutor in the program and are ready to jump in now as full-fledged volunteers. The rest are almost there. Interim Literacy Director Amy Prevedel is pleased to have volunteers get involved right away in the program and begin working with learners who come in to the drop-in learning lab for tutoring.

Two Alameda Reads learners have gained skills and a great deal of confidence to begin doing volunteer work as a first step in gaining job experience in the U.S. One learner began volunteering for an Asian

medicine advocacy group. She is gaining so much knowledge on the job, and hopes her work will turn into paid employment this fall. Another learner started volunteering in the Dewey's café at the library. She loves the library! And, she is thrilled that her English language skills have improved so much that she can now interact with customers and give back to the community through her volunteerism.

Another learner has passed her pre-police academy exams with flying colors. She is now on the fast-track to begin the full Police Academy this fall. The City of Richmond is specifically interested in her promise to help them implement community-based policing, and is sponsoring her in the training. Her tutor came to Alameda Reads after retiring from working in the justice system and conducting training for court employees. Her unique knowledge set for criminal justice made for a perfect match with our learner who decided she wanted to become a police officer.

Alameda Reads continues to do great things!!
