| I ive in the West End within a l/4 mile of Webster Street and transit services.
As documented by the City of Al ameda (please see attached) parking is a
major problem in the neighborhood. As a result, some have illegally paved
over their yards or regularly park in illegal spaces. There is no requirement in
this ordinance that prohibits residents in second units from owning cars.
Transit service is of little use if the buses do not go where you need them to
go. Job situations can change overnight and while a bus can take you to some
jobs, it may not take you to the one you have at the time. Even if one takes
transit to work, a car may be needed for other trips - and if one owns a car,
then a space is needed to park it. The car has to be somewhere. Al so, many
buses are al ready overcrowded. By the time the bus gets to Webster Street, it
i s often standing room only. Someti mes the buses are so packed, they have
to pass up stops on Webster Street.
While well intentioned, adding units while not adding parking only makes the parking situation worse. Even more yards will be paved for parking and parking in red zones will increase. Please look at the attached study done by our own City. Where will the residents of the new units park their cars?
