SSHRB Background

- Established in 1917 as the City of Alameda Board of Social Services, and charged with advising the Council on all matters pertaining to the care and relief of the needy.
- In 1977, City Charter was amended to change the name to the Social Service Human Relations Board (SSHRB).
 Its mission is to create an environment which encourages and brings about mutual understanding, respect, and good will among groups of people in the community.
- Assessment & Awareness Workgroup
- Periodic Community Needs Surveys are one of the tools used by SSHRB to identify needs.

Community Needs Survey

- SSHRB administers the survey every five years.
- Data is collected and used to enable the Board to recommend funding of Federal and City grants to administer social service programs in the City of Alameda.
- Survey data is also available for non-profits to use while writing grants benefitting Alameda residents.
