WHEREAS the events in Charlottville by New-Nazi, KKK white supremacists are condemned across the nation as despicable and against all we hold dear as Americans and as Alamedans; and

WHEREAS within the space of a-week two wees, two white supremacist attacks were delivered to the heart of our City, and

The Temple AND (SLAMIC CENTER)

WHEREAS leaders across the nation have declared it time to unequivocally say "no" at every turn to this this abomination, and walk the walk by removing the signs and symbols of racism and white supremacy from the midst of their towns and cities - reminders of a dogma that has in the past and continues to tear our country and city apart; and

WHEREAS Alameda's Calhoun Street was named for John C. Calhoun, South Carolina Senator, a politician who approvator slavery, owned dozens of slaves and asserted that slavery, rather than being a "necessary evil", was a "positive good", benefiting both slaves and slave owners. And

WHEREAS there is a distinction between *remembering history*, which Santayana warms us we should never stop doing, and *glorifying history*.

THEREFORE be it RESOLVED: Calhoun Street shall be re-named Heather Hyer Street in honor of the young woman who lost her life to Nazi and white supremacist violence in Charlottsville. Let this unique name, in the midst of an array of Presidential names, serve as a reminder for all time that Alameda does not tolerate hate, and that white supremacy and racism have no place in our City.
