- Provide data that community-based organizations can utilize in supporting current clientele as well as areas for potential new programming.




Outreach

- Survey posted on City website; sent out via multiple social networking platforms; printed copies were available at several locations.
- Survey was available online and in print in English, Spanish and Chinese.
- 1,781 households responded: 5.9% of all Alameda households (based on 2010 Census Data)



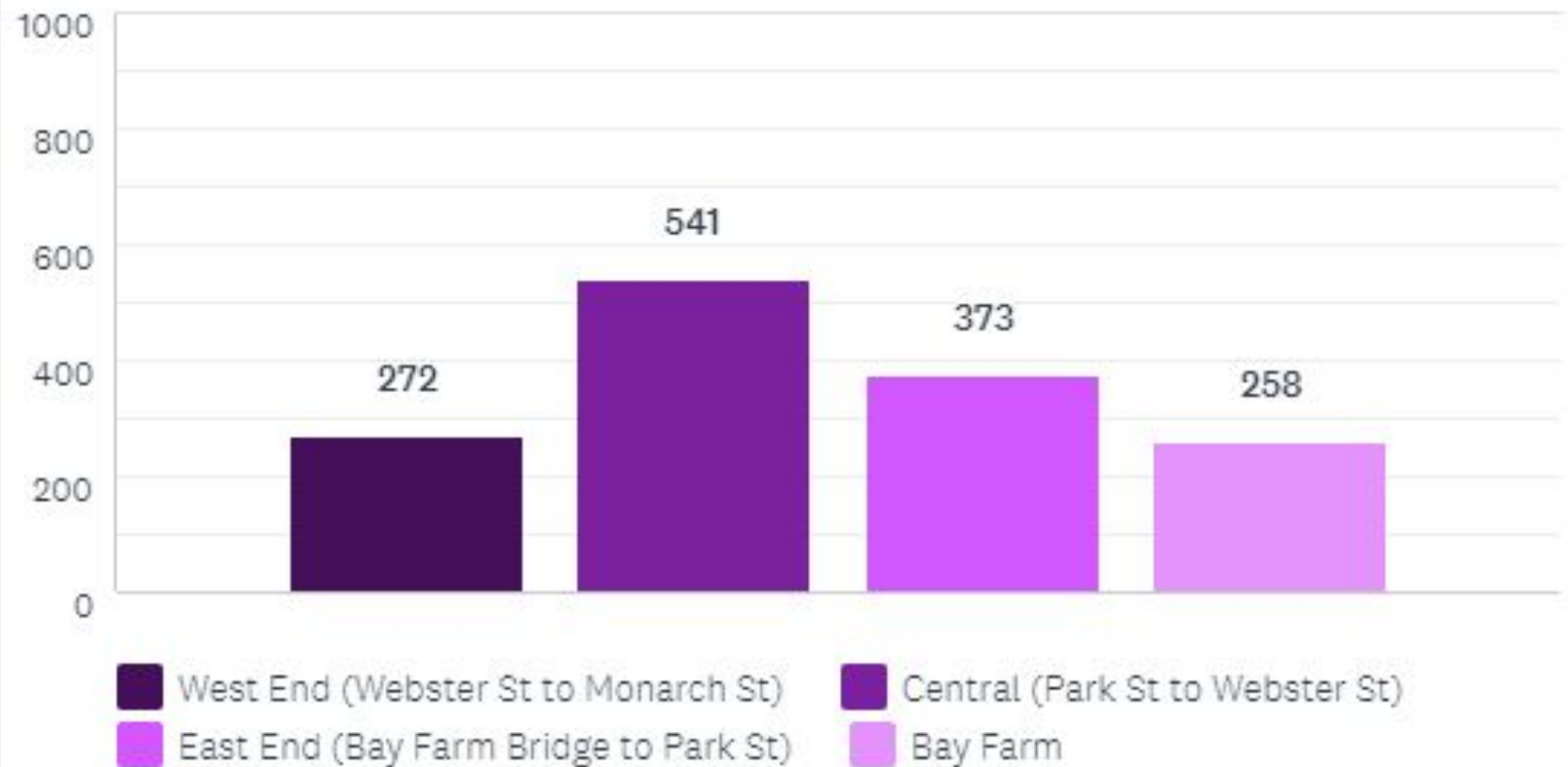

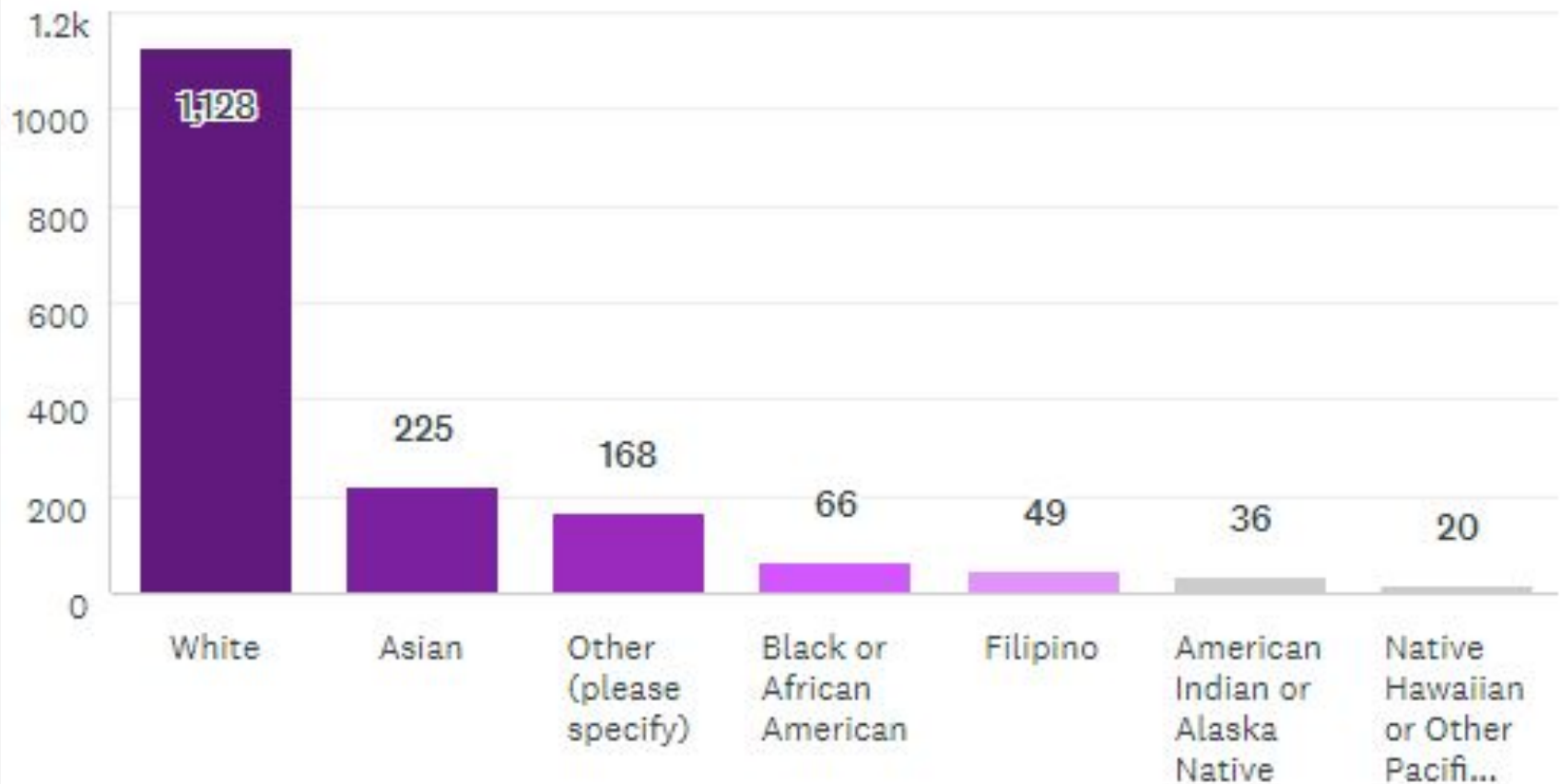

- “High need” rating determined to be the most reliable indication of top community priorities
- Community need ratings were analyzed using six subgroup filters
 - Children in Home
 - Income Level
 - Mastick User
 - Disability Diagnosis in HH
 - Geography
 - Own/Rent
- Challenges with demographic data collection

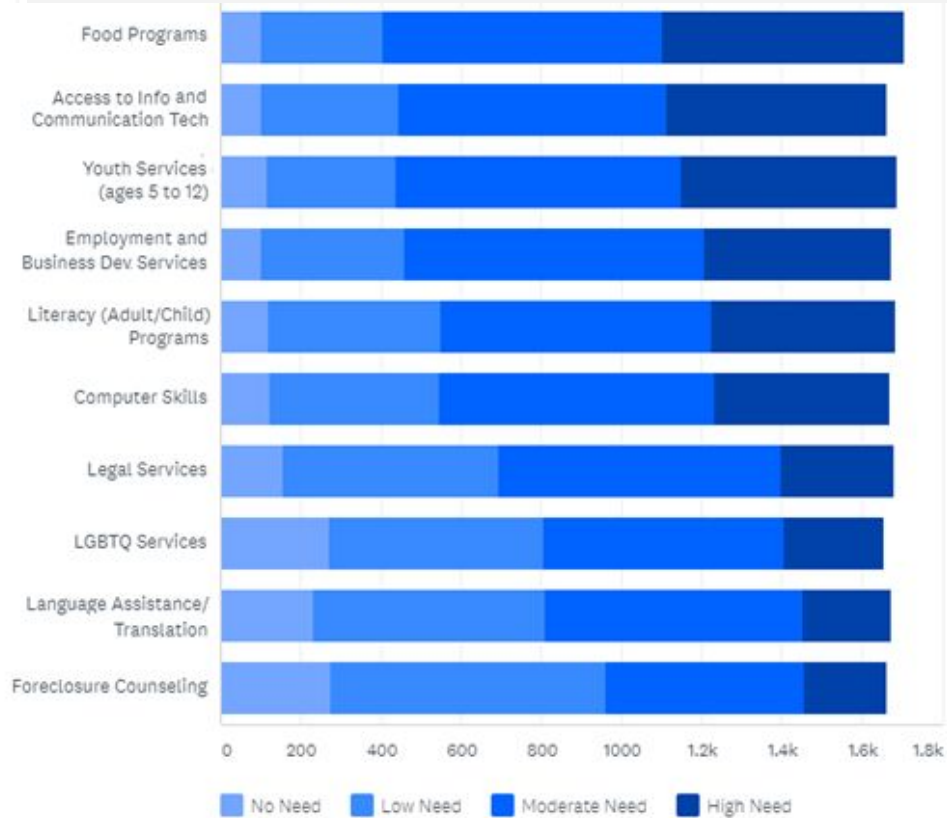

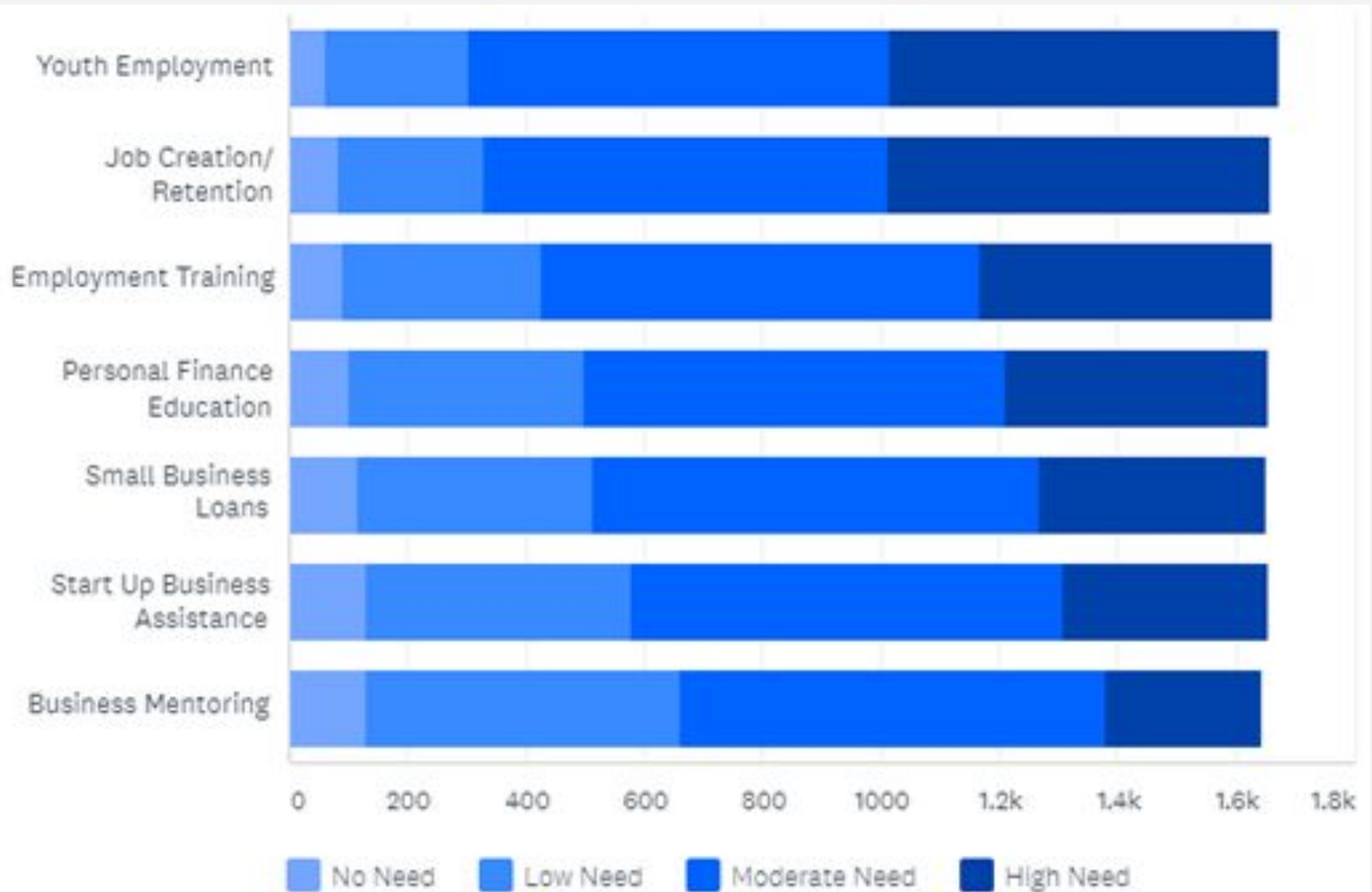

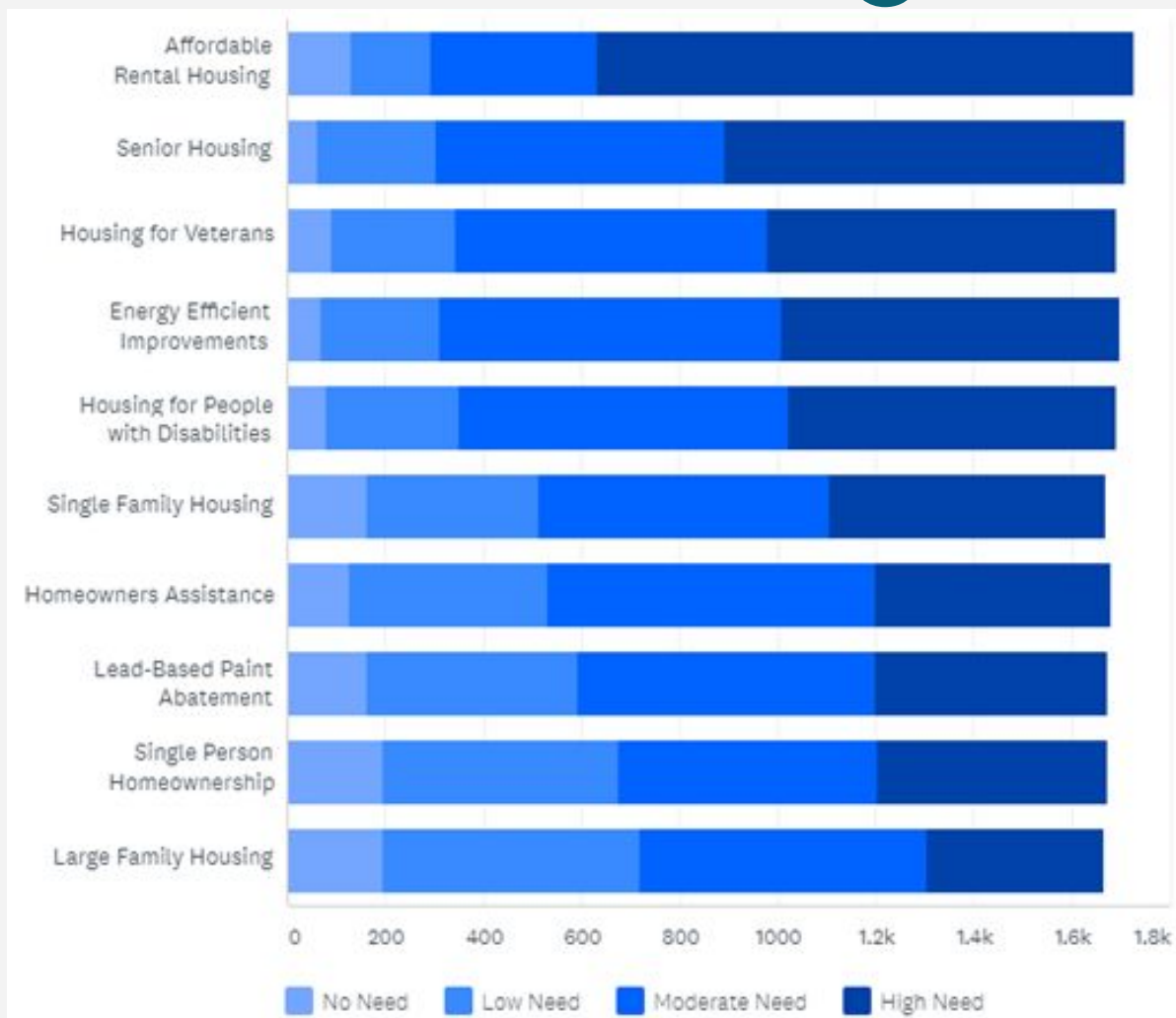

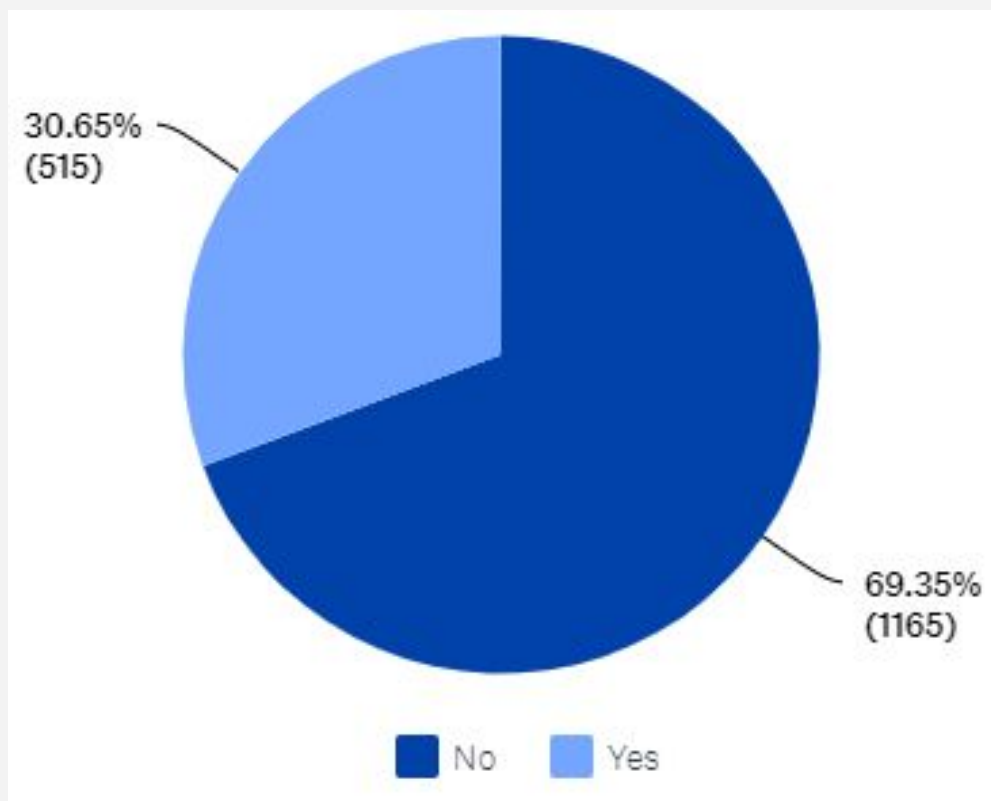

Summary Findings

- Most subgroups identified similar top “high need” services and facilities, with a few exceptions along demographic lines.
- Affordability of housing and traffic congestion were predominant concerns in respondent comments.
- 20% more people reported housing discrimination than in 2012.
