Whereas,	LGBTQ History Month sends an important message to the nation's teachers, school boards, community leaders, and youth about the vital importance of recognizing and exploring the role of LGBTQ people in American history; and
Whereas,	LGBTQ History Month is recognized as an important and effective means of educating and calling to action the citizens of Alameda to work together to fight prejudice and discrimination; and
Whereas,	the community's knowledge and understanding of LGBTQ history better enables and supports all individuals and families in pursuit of a dignified and respectable life; and
Whereas,	the Oakland Gay Men's Chorus, formerly known as the Oakland East Bay Gay Men's Chorus, is the Pride of the East Bay, with singers from throughout the East Bay, including Alameda. Singers include all tenor and bass ranges, gay, straight, transgender and bi-sexual. They began in 1999 and are celebrating their 20th Anniversary Season. They are a more than 50 voice gay men's chorus that performs a wide variety of music, from Classical to Broadway. The Oakland East Bay Gay Men's Chorus is the most active and well-known Gay Arts organization in the Oakland and East Bay region of California. They foster social justice and oppose discrimination through inclusion and education.
