


Proposition 6 Puts Transportation Funding at Risk

Overview of Senate Bill 1 (SB 1) - 2017


- First major increase in state transportation funding in decades
- Enables cities and counties to address significant maintenance and safety needs on the local street and road system
- Funds highway, bridge bicycle and pedestrian safety, and public transit projects
- Bay Area will receive about \$390 million per year in new funding for local roads and transit, plus tens of millions more for highways and transit construction.

Pothole Peril – Impact on Pavement



City of Alameda Local Road Funding at Risk (FY 2015-2022)




Local Projects at Risk

Proposition 6 cuts funding for Alameda road repairs and improvements

- \$1.3M Annually lost to the city budget for street and sidewalk Repair
- State Route 61 Encinal Avenue Pavement Project \$8.
 million
 - Upgrade curb ramps, crosswalks and improve Broadway/Encinal Avenue to Sherman Street
- 59 New AC Transit Hybrid Buses








Transit Impacts for Alameda

- Proposition 6 also cuts state transit funding for the Bay Area
- Impacts in Alameda

Dollars in millions

Operator	2018-2019 Funding at Risk
BART	\$25.38M
AC Transit	\$13.1M
Alameda Ferry	\$1.15M
BAY AREA WIDE	\$156.27M

Summary: Impacts of Prop 6 on Alameda

If SB 1 is repealed, Alameda will lose...

- Millions of dollars in city funds dedicated to local road maintenance and public safety
- Reduced transit service and lost maintenance funding
- Delayed and cancelled highway, rail, goods movement, roads, bridges, trails and pedestrian safety projects
