

FAAS + City of Alameda



FAAS mission is to shelter and care for abandoned companion animals, find them new homes, and prevent animal cruelty through education and community programs.


Through a unique public-private partnership, FAAS has managed the open-intake City of Alameda Animal Shelter since January 2012.

In July 2017, FAAS and the City entered into a new two-year service agreement with a two-year option to extend.

FAAS by the Numbers July 2017 – June 2018

- 1,024 Live Animals / 486 Deceased Animals
- 28 Animals Passed Away of Natural Causes
- 36 Animals were Euthanized; 27 for severe and untreatable health conditions
- 82 Animals were Transferred to Private Humane Societies/Rescue Groups
- 173 Animals Returned to Owners
- 613 Animals Adopted into Loving Homes
- Asilomar Formula = 99% Live Release Rate

FAAS Never Euthanizes for Time or Space.






























The Community Responds: Volunteerism

- In-Kind Value = \$416,717







- Improved Lighting



10 GREAT REASONS TO LEASH YOUR DOG








Future Challenges
