Director Williams introduced Debi Stebbins who had recently assumed the Executive Director role for the District. Debi reviewed what she saw as her primary role and reponsibilities in this new position (3-D)

Mr. Fonseca reported on the status of the project to seismically retrofit Alameda Hospital to be compliant with 2013 seismic standards (State has extended the deadline to 2020). The project is a complex one since it involves the relocation of several departments in a sequential fashion. It also includes a retrofit of two smaller buildings, the Stephens and West Wings while patient care continues in adjacent sites. The existing kitchen will be relocated from the original hospital building to the Stephens Wing. There was extensive discussion of the impact on the surrounding neighbors when construction begins, including the need for communication of the construction project and need to mitigate parking congestion. This will include the need for arrangements for construction workers to park in an off-site location. (3-E)

Chief Rodriguez provided an update on the Community Paramedicine Program noting key metrics and successes of the program. He provided an update on the pending legislation including the proposed language on SB944 and AB1795. There was discussion on the role and scope of the paramedics related to the community paramedicine legislation. (3-E)
