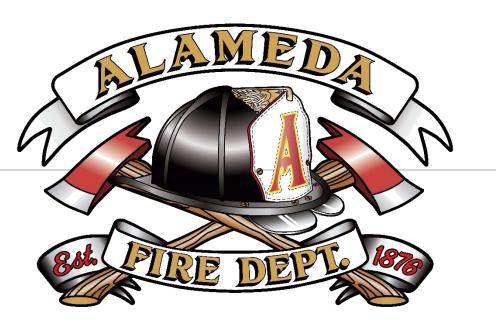
FIRE PREVENTION BUREAU FEE STUDY IMPLEMENTATION

Fire Prevention Fee Changes

Fees were last studied in 2013, costs to provide services has increased over time

Utilized outside firm to study/evaluate: NBS with other City Depts.

Includes current adopted 2016 CA Fire Code Fees and inspections- High Rise, Radio coverage, CO Systems, Fire Pumps, Special Permits on an annual basis

Improves Fire False Alarm responses and fees - Annual basis, inspections to improve systems

Fee changes cover the annual costs of a Fire Marshal position per Council direction (July 2018) with total Division cost recovery at 48% (Yr. 1) to 59% (Yr. 4)

Authorize the Fire Chief to handle fee inquires and Code changes/exceptions

Staff Recommendations

- 1. Adopt the proposed Annual FPB Fees and implementation schedule
- 2. Add one FTE Division Chief to the FPB Staffing Adopt the proposed New Cost Recovery Fees: EMS and VAC
- 3. Authorize the Fire Chief/designee to administer fee inquires, code exceptions
- 4. Modify the False Alarm Fee Schedule from 6 months to annual (Calendar)

Fire Prevention Fee Changes

Adopt the proposed new hourly inspection rates:

Year	Rate	Collection Percentage
2019/20	\$150.00	48%
2020/21	\$180.00	57%
2021/22	\$180.00 (No change)	57%
2022/23	\$200.00	59%

Cost of Fire Marshall \$355,000

*At the new proposed rate of \$150 with 4,602 proposed billable hours for inspections will generate approximately \$847,541 with an additional \$30,000 in re-inspection fees to cover this position. The total recoverable expenses of the Fire Prevention Division annual budget is \$1,750,000 and these revenues will cover 48% of the budget in Year 1 and 59% of the budget by Year 4.

Proposed EMS Cost Recovery Fee

3 and 5 Year Time and Response Study - Total time for response, mitigation, clean-up, return, restock and reporting averaged one (1) hour

Proposed Fee Components:	
3 – Person Crew	\$223
Dispatch Costs	\$42 (Per call from ACRECC)
Supplies	\$20 (Boundtree Vendor estimate)
Vehicle Expenses	\$45 (1/2 Hour OES reimbursement rate)
City Admin Rate (.19279)	\$58
Total	\$388 per Incident

Includes applicable OPEB and PERS unfunded liabilities

Proposed EMS Cost Recovery Fee

Process

Include with each Ambulance Transport Invoice (Bundled)

Coverage provided through Private Health Insurers (Kaiser, Blue Shield)

Medicare and Medi-Cal patients exempt from fee (Changes in 2021)

- Over 5,000 billable EMS responses per year
- Estimated Annual Cost Recovery: \$332,000

Proposed Vehicle Accident Collision (VAC) Cost Recovery Fee

- CA Auto Insurance Policies covers emergency responses to vehicle accidents
- Cost analysis and methodology are identical to the proposed EMS Fees
- Over 200 billable responses per year
- Estimated Annual Cost Recovery: \$70,000

Cost Recovery Comparison

Other East Bay area communities have adopted similar EMS Cost Recovery Fees. A sample comparison is as follows:

City of Berkeley:	425.00
City of Oakland:	450.00
Moraga/Orinda Fire District:	380.00
San Ramon Valley Fire District:	495.00
Alameda County FD:	200.00
City of Albany:	350.00
City of Alameda:	388.00 (Proposed)
Average (excluding Alameda)	383.33

Future EMS Cost Recovery Changes

Medicare developing first responder cost allocation for the delivery of healthcare - 2020 rollout (est.) Proposed fee structure delayed by the IAFC/IAFF in 2018 - Provider vs. Supplier of healthcare

Fee structure will include first responder at BLS and ALS for delivery of healthcare for those on Medicare first, then become adopted by Medi-Cal.

Proposed Fee example:

AFD EMS Fee - 388 x (5,050 x 50% of responses = 2,025) 2,025= **\$785,000 potential revenue**

IGT changes - (Intergovernmental transfer)= Formula and methodology used by hospitals Proposed CA legislation - Remove the current GEMT and QAF for public entities, move into an IGT Revenue potential: Current Medicare Rate: 357/transport- Cost of 2,000/transport = \$1,643 loss IGT coverage of this loss = (2,025 patients) **\$3,327,075**

Final Recommendations

Implement the proposed Annual FPB Fees incrementally over the next four (4) years

Add one (1) FTE Division Chief Fire Marshal position to the FPB

Implement the proposed two (2) New Cost Recovery Fees: EMS and VAC

Authorize the Fire Chief or designee to administer fee inquires and code exceptions

Modify the False Alarm Fee Schedule from 6 months to annual (Calendar)
