Approx. 15% affordable (not 56%)

Expedite the review of affordable housing.

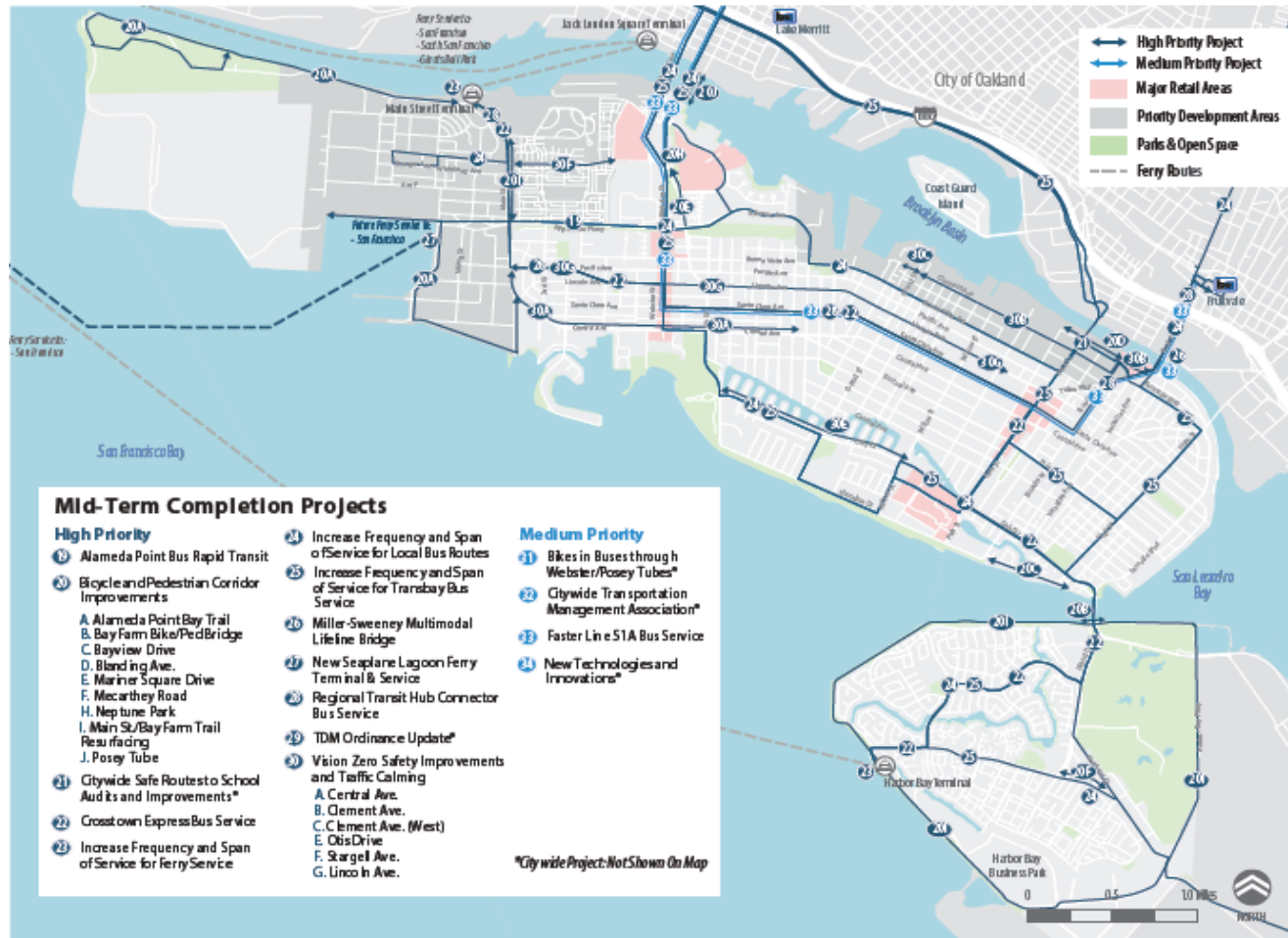
Review local zoning codes and fees for affordable, workforce, and affordable by design housing.
