Significant exposure to litigation pursuant to paragraph (2) of subdivision (d) and paragraph (3) of subdivision (e) of Government Code Section 54956.9 Number of cases: One (As Defendant - City Exposure to Legal Action)

This case involves a legal challenged raised by Developer Carmel Partners against the City's imposition of development impact fees ("DIF") to the North Housing Admiral's Cove Project. Carmel previously paid approximately \$2,116,050 in DIF under protest. The Council authorized the City Attorney to settle this matter by refunding \$1,473,300 in previously paid DIF, while retaining the remaining \$642,750. In exchange, Carmel has agreed to forgo all challenges against the current DIF or any future amendments to the DIF ordinance and any related nexus study (a) so long as the City does not seek to apply any such future amended DIF to this Project and (b) the future DIF is adopted no later than December 31, 2020.
