Subject: Public Engagement Plan - Draft

This Public Engagement Plan outlines the approach for community engagement for the City of Alameda's Active Transportation Plan (Plan) and details the responsibilities of Toole Design and City staff.

Throughout this planning effort and in line with the draft Equity Framework, the City and Toole Design are seeking to conduct true engagement, versus only outreach. *Outreach* is defined as informing people and organizations about what is happening as a part of this planning effort. *Engagement* is defined as being open to hearing what people think, hearing their hopes and fears, integrating what we hear, and being open to that taking us in different directions, or resulting in us needing to be clear about what is and is not possible.

PUBLIC ENGAGEMENT GOALS

The main goal of the Public Engagement Plan is to develop and facilitate meaningful engagement activities that engage with a broad range and high number of people who live, work, play, and do business in Alameda. Additional goals for public engagement include:

- Creating an equitable and balanced Plan whose recommendations reflect the needs and values of the people and neighborhoods of Alameda.
- Creating opportunities for disadvantaged community members, people of color and low-income people to participate meaningfully.
- Informing the Alameda community about the Plan, planning process, and opportunities for involvement.
- Identifying and engaging key stakeholders interested in, or potentially affected by, the proposed Plan policies, projects, and programs.
- Increasing the number of people who are aware of and involved in the planning process.
- Soliciting input on current walking and biking issues, barriers, and opportunities.
- Engaging people who are interested in biking and walking but may not do so today.
- Asking questions such as, in Alameda:
 - What stresses you about biking?
 - What stresses you about walking?
 - What stresses you when you're driving and people are walking and biking?
- Identifying community needs and priorities for enhancing walking and bicycling in Alameda
- Building momentum and support for the future implementation of pedestrian and bicycle projects.

INTERACTION WITH KEY STAKEHOLDERS

1. Technical Advisory Committee (TAC)

- Includes community stakeholders and key representatives from City Departments, such as Planning, Building and Transportation; Public Works; Police; Fire; and Recreation & Parks.
- Composition of the TAC should be representative of the diverse makeup of the Alameda Community.
- Proposed to meet four times during the development of the Plan at key milestones.
- Toole Design will attend up to four meetings and will assist the City by preparing materials, as

 - i. Meeting #1: Project kick-off

2. Focus Groups

- Conducting focus group meetings are an effective way of gathering input from often underrepresented groups in the planning process, or those who have specific concerns to be discussed.
- Toole Design will organize and facilitate up to four focus group discussions. City staff will organize and facilitate additional ones, as needed.
- Potential invitees and groupings include:
 - i. Alameda Unified School District, students
 - ii. Bike Walk Alameda
 - Business Groups: Downtown Alameda Business Association (DABA), West Alameda Business Association (WABA), Chamber of Commerce, Greater Alameda Business Association (GABA)
 - iv. Low Income Communities: Alameda Point Collaborative, Housing Authority residents, Food Bank, Alameda Family Services
 - v. Parks: Bay Trail, East Bay Regional Parks District, Recreation and Parks Commission members
 - vi. People with Disabilities: Commission on Disability members, Center for Independent Living
 - vii. Seniors: Mastick, Fire Department Senior Outreach
 - viii. Transit: AC Transit, Water Emergency Transportation Authority (WETA)

3. General Public and Community Groups

- The entire Alameda community will be invited and asked to participate in engagement events for the Plan. To spread the word about the events, the following groups and their members will be invited (list will expand as more groups are identified):
 - i. Members of City Commissions, including: Transportation, Disability, Recreation and Parks, Planning Board and Social Service Human Relations Board.
 - ii. Schools Students (especially middle and high schoolers) and parents, College of Alameda
 - iii. Neighborhood Associations

- iv. Business Groups, including WABA, DABA, Chamber of Commerce, GABA, Alameda Point businesses, Harbor Bay Business Park Association, Alameda Transportation Management Association, South Shore Center
- v. Community Organizations, including Bike Walk Alameda, Alameda Point Collaborative, Community Action for a Sustainable Alameda (CASA).
- vi. Homeowners Associations
- vii. Alameda Peeps
- viii. Additional research/suggestions requested for: Asian, African-American and Latinx communities.
- Inform key stakeholders and the City's Transportation Awareness Group members about upcoming opportunities for input so that they can spread the word to their members/communities.
- The City will continue to maintain a list of the interested public, who will be informed of key
 opportunities for input. The community will be able to sign up for this list on the project web page
 and at events.

4. Transportation Commission

- Toole Design will attend and develop materials for up to five Transportation Commission meetings. Topics include:
 - i. Meeting #1: Project kick-off
 - ii. Meeting #2: Discuss key community feedback, draft vision and goals
 - iii. Meeting #3: Discuss the key findings from the existing conditions report and the needs analysis
 - iv. Meeting #4: Discuss draft bicycle and pedestrian networks and prioritization
 - v. Meeting #5: Draft plan review
- The Transportation Commission typically meets in odd months; however, if needed, special meetings will be scheduled.

5. City Council

 Toole Design will present the draft and final versions of the Plan to the City Council and will be on hand to shepherd the document through various stages of City leadership approvals to garner support and champions for the Plan.

TIMELINE

The Plan development and community engagement will be broken out into three key phases which are tied to major milestones:

- Phase 1: Project Launch
- Phase 2: Review of Draft Bicycle Network and Pedestrian Improvements
- Phase 3: Draft Plan

Phase 1: Project Launch

Timeframe: September - November 2019

Key Messages (Note: text will be refined in partnership with City): The City of Almeda is updating its Pedestrian and Bicycle Plans to create a new Active Transportation Plan, and we can't do this without you! To create this Plan, we need to hear from you: do you ride a bike or walk to work, school, or for errands? Would you like to, but don't feel comfortable or safe today? What do you like or dislike about walking or biking in Alameda? How would you like to improve biking throughout the city? Where is it uncomfortable for you to walk in Alameda?

You experience this every day, and your input is an indispensable and vital part of this plan. There are lots of ways to get involved, both online and in person.

Kick-off Intensive

To launch the community engagement process, Toole Design will facilitate a two-day intensive with a variety of engagement activities. The purpose of the workshop is to build community excitement and momentum around the Plan update, gather input about what it's like to walk and bike in Alameda today, and immerse City staff and the project team in the beginning phases of Plan development.

The intensive will include:

- City staff and project team meetings
- Evening community workshop.
- All workshop materials will be placed in a public location for the community to see and interact with over two days.
- Walking/Biking audits Toole Design proposes holding four audits
- Focus groups Toole Design proposes holding all four focus group meetings during the intensive, pending stakeholder schedules.

To plan for the workshop, Toole Design will prepare a memorandum that is submitted to the City which outlines the kick-off intensive schedule and activities.

Walking and Biking Audits

The walking and biking audits will provide community stakeholders with a window into the planning and design process and will help the project team understand community members' daily experiences and concerns. Locations will include a variety of contexts from business districts, school zones, residential neighborhoods, off-island linkages, trails and other important walking and bicycling sites. Toole Design will work with the City and the Technical Advisory Committee to identify invitees and locations of walking and bicycling audits. The walking audits will be held during Phase 1 of the engagement process to gather feedback to be used in the network development.

Reaching out to Youth

The City has expressed interest in including children and youth in the planning process and reaching out to students, parents, and Alameda Unified School District (AUSD) staff. Below are ideas for engaging with youth:

- Sharing information and engagement opportunities during October 2nd International Walk and Roll to School Day
- Using the School District's email contact lists to share information about engagement opportunities and encourage students and families to provide input via the web-based map, as appropriate.
- Holding a focus group meeting with middle and/or high school students
- Holding a pop-up event at a school function
- Holding a walk or bike audit near a school campus and inviting school staff, parents, and students

- At community workshops, include activities and engagement for young children and youth, in addition to adults.
- Engage with AUSD's Round Table on Diversity, Equity and Inclusion

Phase 2: Review of Draft Bicycle Network and Pedestrian Improvements

Timeframe: January - July 2020

Key Messages (*Note: text will be refined in partnership with City*): We've been busy! We've spent the last few months gathering community input and data and analyzing the existing bicycle and pedestrian network. We've drafted recommendations for new projects (such as new bikeways and pedestrian improvements) and for programs that support walking and bicycling - We want to know what you think.

During this phase, Toole Design will also provide education about different types of bikeways, pedestrian improvements, and supportive facilities and trade-offs, report on the network analysis, and determine what criteria the community wants to use to prioritize projects.
