Background

- Low probability of impacting Alameda
- High risk of significant damage



Tsunamis in California

- 100 tsunamis since 1800
- 13 caused damage
- 5 caused human casualties
- 1964 tsunami from Alaska M9.2 killed 13 in CA
- 2011 tsunami from Japan resulted in 1 death in CA











Tsunami Description


- Rapid changes in water level and unpredictable dangerous currents
- Magnified in marinas
- Can inundate bay communities


