As a Bay Farm resident and FAAS volunteer, I am writing in support of the plan for the Bay Farm North Loop animal shelter. I understand that there has been some concern regarding the two planned outdoor dog runs.

This concern puzzles me, even though I live in close proximity, since use of the runs is restricted to between 8am and 8pm, and dogs in the outdoor areas will be supervised 1:1. In addition, the outdoor dog runs/training areas will primarily be used for meeting with prospective adopters and for one-on-one training. At no time will dogs be allowed on the runs after 8pm or before 8am, or unsupervised at any time. As a FAAS volunteer and supporter for several years, I believe that FAAS has taken every precaution to assure that neighboring residents will not be disturbed.

I am concerned that if the shelter is restricted to only one outdoor run, it could adversely affect adoptions: prospective adopters wouldn't be able to "meet and greet" with the animal if a lone run was already in use, or if weather, damage or other problems prevented its use.

I am requesting that you approve the plans as previously submitted and approved, including the two outdoor dog runs.
