Honorable Mayor and Members of the Alameda City Council

Given the public's increasingly frequent expressions of distrust of the motivation underlying the actions of some of our elected officials I believe it would be best to avoid actions that at the very least appear to be designed to further someone's political ambitions at the public's expense. Incumbents have an inherently significant and, I believe, unfair advantage over challengers when it comes to making presentations to the public, and I believe we should mitigate this advantage whenever practical, especially when such presentations appear to be for the benefit of a single, or possibly two, potential candidates and are funded by the City. Policy Proposal

Use of City resources to support Councilmember-initiated events

Whereas it seems inappropriate for the City to provide resources including Staff time and the use of City facilities that are, or give the appearance of, supporting campaigns for election to public office, the following policy will be established:

• <u>Subject</u> – If an event such as a forum, town hall, workshop, or other planned gathering is Councilmember-initiated, the topic must be one that is under <u>current</u> consideration by the City Council.

<u>Frequency</u> - For each Councilmember, the number of events would be limited to one Councilmember-initiated event per quarter;

• <u>Election Black-out Window</u> - The use of City resources and/or facilities may not be permitted to support any Councilmember-initiated events during the 12 months preceding an election in which the Councilmember will be eligible to run for re-election or run for any other public office.

• <u>Amount of Staff Time</u> – No Staff, facility, or other resources shall be allocated in support of any Councilmember-initiated event during the "Election Blackout Window".

*The aforementioned parameters *cannot* be waived or changed for a specific event.
