Draft concept for developing a community-led, council supported, citywide discussion on how to provide and ensure safety and security for all Alamedans.

Phase I: Goals / Objectives:

Setting up a community led process for identifying the goals and objectives for a comprehensive discussion

Monday June 29th Actions:

- Determine general scope for consideration.
 - o Proposed: Just and effective safety and security for all in Alameda
- Identify two councilmembers to serve as an ex officio member on steering committee
- Agree upon steering committee membership outline
- Request staff review Chief Rolleri's June 10th policy recommendations and identify short-term actions that can support response policy adjustments

Proposed Process (one month):

- 1. Identify a steering committee for the development of the scope and goal
 - a. 7-9 people
 - i. Center Black and youth voices
 - ii. Two councilmembers will be an ex-officio non-voting members
 - iii. Members reflecting wide breadth of our community. At minimum:
 - 1. Must be from Alameda: Geographic diversity (West/East/BFI)
 - 2. Gender diversity
 - 3. Multiple members from the Black community
 - 4. Three members representing community interest groups
 - 5. Two members from the business community
 - 6. Two members from high impacted community (regional impacts)
 - b. City to provide food for planning meetings and ensure needed technology
- 2. Hold multiple Town Hall meetings in July to develop a consensus Goals and Objectives within the identified scope.
- 3. Before July 3rd, City staff to arrange 5 Town Halls the weeks for July 13th and July 20th, array of times and days to accommodate different schedules. Publicize list July 6th.
- 4. Return to a special council meeting for concurrence with proposed goals and outcomes during the week of July 27th

Phase 2: Steering subcommittees

Five focused steering committees: Policy; Unbundling; Decriminalizing of survival; Anti-racism; Oversight and accountability

Monday June 29th Actions:

- Identify a councilmember lead for each steering committee
 - Consider whether/how to choose a partner to work on the committee?
 - Are there Brown Act concerns about overlapping committee assignments?
- Agree to a timeline for process development
- Agree to guidance for steering committee and process development
- Agree that Steering Committee in Phase I will confirm membership of committee steering subcommittees
- Identify whether or not subcommittees should have consistent membership and workplan structure (would change Proposed Process)

Proposed Process (first month):

- 1. Outline a proposed scope for consideration
- 2. Identify a steering committee make up and process for determining
- 3. Propose a timeline for the work with specific meeting and deliverable milestones
- 4. Identify staffing resource needs
- 5. Return to a special council meeting for input and concurrence with proposed process during the week of July 27th

Next Steps:

- July 27th meeting
 - Approve Goals/Objectives
 - o Approve final subcommittee development process
- August -kick off steering committee development
 - o Confirm membership, identify August/September meeting schedules
 - o Identify if there are short-term items for action
