The <u>RE:Source guide</u> is the latest generation of online search tools from StopWaste, intended to provide answers for what to do with the things you no longer need as well as comprehensive <u>city-specific curbside</u> <u>service information</u> on what goes where. It replaces the previous online guide RecycleWhere.org, and is faster and easier to use.

By providing regularly updated reuse and repair alternatives to disposal, RE:Source is also designed to serve as an educational tool to help extend the life of materials as much as possible by promoting the best and highest use.

Users can also browse <u>Material Fact Sheets</u>, which include more in-depth educational information about safe disposal and recycling of special items like batteries or clothing, and help consumers understand the environmental impacts and lifecycle of different materials.
