We have five trainees in the police academy. One graduates this Friday. (They are not counted in the 68)

Patrol staffing

January 2021 – Changed deployment scheme to allow additional staffing in Investigations Division. Patrol schedule designed for 36 officers supervised by 8 sergeants. Currently 32 officers³ and 7 sergeants. Minimum staffing adjusted down to 3 officers plus 1 sergeant in the wee hours of the morning.

Traffic (motorcycle officers)

Allotted 6 officers and 1 sergeant. Currently 2 officers and an acting sergeant.

Investigations

Allotted 15 detectives and 2 sergeants. Currently 3 detectives and 2 sergeants

Supervision and Management

7 people in acting positions (Chief, 3 acting lieutenants, 3 acting sergeants)

Stats

APD handled 52,484 CFS in 2020 (63,320 in 2019)
Took 5,652 reports (7,869 in 2019)
Wrote 2,028 citations (5,298 in 2019)
Made 933 Arrests (1,395 in 2019)

(Force used 21 times – 10 of those were control holds/physical strength only)

Crime

Part 1 crimes: Down 2.6% in 2020 (They went up 19.3% in 2019)
Part 1 and 2: Down a total of 8.3% (2019 – up a total of 8.7%)

Overall crime remains relatively low from some significant "peaks" in the early 1990s

Why does it "feel like" crime is up? Some high profile events

- 3 murders (none in 2019)
- Robberies and assaults are up (19% and 9.7%, respectively)
- Auto thefts are at a 35 year high (up 16% over last year)
- Shootings are up dramatically

Shooting data/details

2017 = 6 2018 = 7 2019 = 3 2020 = 17 January 2021 = 4

- This seems to be both a regional and national phenomena.
- Oakland has already had 14 murders this year (only one in January 2020)
- In the majority of our shootings, the suspect is known to the victim
- "Random" shootings are extremely rare. However, anytime there is gunfire in an urban setting, it's dangerous
- Of the 17 shootings in 2020, we've made arrests in 7 cases so far

Traffic Enforcement

- 541 collisions in 2020 (143 injury; 4 fatalities)
 - o Down from 744 collisions (200 injury) in 2019. But only one fatality in 2019
 - Of the 2,028 citations written, 1,983 were for moving violations (down considerably from 2019)

Homeless

One of the great challenges for our time

It seems to be a ubiquitous problem across the entire west coast

Primarily a social services issues, not a law enforcement one

But clearly there is a law enforcement component

Policy: Homelessness is not a crime...[we] will not use homelessness solely as a basis for detention or law enforcement action.

Of the 933 arrests we made in 2020, 270 or 29%, were listed as transient at the time of arrest

Communications/Press/Social Media

Source of concern and occasional frustration

- Goals:
 - Transparency,
 - o Keeping the public informed of public safety matters
 - Crime prevention and safety tips
 - Connecting the community with its police department

Trying to find the right platform to engage and inform

Pushing for faster release of info involving violent crime

Criticism that we cherry pick who we respond to on SM.

Keeping up with comments and questions is labor intensive.

Plans/Initiatives

Fully cooperating with City Manager's Steering Committee on Police Reform and Racial Equity.

Trying to address our current challenges;

Dealing with crime and disorder amid – especially during the pandemic

Advising personnel to limit in-person contact with people including suspected violators

Jail not always holding people

Courts backlogged/not processing people and cases

Added staffing to Investigations Division in January⁴ (two people from Patrol, a third couldn't go)

Partnering with regional and federal partners to address shootings

This includes local, state, and federal forensic laboratories

Directed patrols, including foot patrols (only when staffing and CFS permit)

Training more personnel in Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED)

Increasing our crime prevention services
