Background

- July 2021 City Council authorized pilot program to respond to mental health crisis calls for service
- Pilot Program will provide a different response to certain calls
 - FD personnel identified (*completed*)
 - Training (*in-progress*)
 - FD & PD Dispatch (*in-progress*)
 - Vehicle (*in-progress*)
 - County approval for 5150 authority (*in-progress*)
 - Metrics (*in-progress*)
 - Clinician and case management (proposed agreement with AFS)

AFS Proposal – Staffing & Cost

- Request for Proposal (RFP) August
- Alameda Family Services
 - Recommending 24/7 support (~\$400,000 per year)
 - Program Director (0.1 FTE)
 - Program Supervisor (1.0 FTE)
 - Quality Assurance Specialist (0.15 FTE)
 - Billing Specialist/Program Admin. (0.15 FTE)
 - Crisis Response Case Manager (1.0 FTE)
 - On-call Clinician (daytime + night) (*hourly*)
 - On-call Clinician (weekend daytime + weekend night) (*hourly*)

AFS Proposal - Goals

- 1. Communication and working relationship with FD/City
- 2. Case management linkage to services (90%)
- 3. Case management engagement w/ services (75% within 30-days of referral)
- 4. Reduce the number of 5150 holds
- 5. Reduce calls to 911 or other hotlines
- 6. Reduce incarceration of callers who are experiencing mental health crisis
- 7. Training for FD personnel

AFS Options

- Option 1 A Licensed Clinician + Case Management (~\$286k)
 - Monday through Friday 9AM to 7PM
- Option 1 B On-call Licensed Clinician + Case Management (~\$204k)
 - Monday through Friday 9AM to 5:30PM
 - Weekends 9AM to 5:30PM
- Option 1C On-call Licensed Clinician + Case Management (~\$263k)
 24/7
- Revised and recommended Combination of Option 1A and 1C (~\$400k)

- Pursue a different option in the AFS proposal;
- Consider other options for meeting the pilot project needs;
- Approve a one-year contract and not include the option for a second year; or
- Redo the RFP process with a modified scope of work.

 To provide for mental health services related to the City's alternative response to calls for mental health crisis support pilot program, <u>authorize the City Manager to negotiate and execute an agreement</u> with AFS for an amount not to exceed \$500,000 for one-year, with an option to extend for an additional year for a not to exceed amount of \$1,000,000.
