



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Street Safety Around Schools



63% of crashes involving younger victims (≤ 18) occurred with a quarter mile of a school while only 38% of Alameda's streets are within a quarter mile of a school.



Alameda is a Vision Zero City

Vision Zero is an international movement that provides a framework for reducing traffic deaths and life-changing injuries to zero, while increasing safe, healthy, equitable mobility for all.


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Safe Routes to School Program

- Support program that offers ped and bicycle education, bike tune-up clinics, and more
- 17 AUSD schools enrolled
- Participation levels vary

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City-Funded Bicycle Safety Education

- Target: all 5th graders in public and private school
- Supplements SR2S bicycle education
- Schools must opt in



Vision Zero Action Plan: School Safety Actions

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School-Related Actions in VZAP

- 15-20 mph speed limits in school zones, as CVC allows (action 4.14)
- AUSD policy (3.6)
- Safety plans for drop-off and pick-up (4.8)
- Pedestrian safety education (3.10)
- Bicyclist safety education for 5th graders (3.11)
- Traffic enforcement near schools (4.5)
- Parent, youth, and AUSD reps on the Vision Zero Advisory Committee (1.2)
- School street safety assessments at all K-12 schools (4.15)
