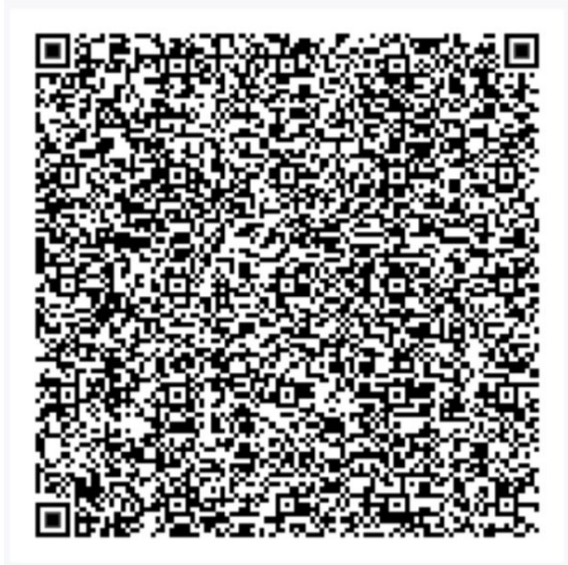

On 1/27/2026, the County of Alameda Board of Supervisors voted unanimously to adopt a critical “ICE-Free Zones” policy that prohibits the use of county-owned property for U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) activity, along with a countywide immigration enforcement response plan.
